Minutes of a meeting of the South Norfolk Licensing and Gambling Acts Committee of South Norfolk Council, held on Monday, 21 August 2023 at 10.00 am.

5. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

No apologies for absence were received.

6. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

No declarations of interest were received.

7. APPLICATION TO VARY A PREMISES LICENCE

The Sub-Committee considered the following application to vary a premises licence at Morrisons Daily, Connaught House, The Street, Hempnall, Norfolk, NR15 2AD.

To extend the licensable activity and opening hours to: 06:00 to 22:00 Monday to Sunday

The Sub-Committee heard evidence and submissions from the Licensing and Enforcement Officer, the agents for the applicant and a representative of Hempnall Parish Council.

The Committee then went into private session to consider the application.

The above parties were re-admitted to the meeting and advised of the decision of the Sub-Committee.

DECISION

The Sub-Committee had due regard to all four licensing objectives and the

evidence in the Licensing and Enforcement Officer's report, as well as the written and oral evidence of all parties put forward at the Hearing. Having regard to the four licensing objectives the Sub-Committee were of the view that the application to vary the premises licence should be granted on the terms sought.

The reasons for this decision were:

The Sub-Committee were satisfied that granting the application to vary the premises licence on the terms sought would not undermine the promotion of the licensing objectives.

RIGHTS OF APPEAL

Rights of appeal are set out in Schedule 5 of the Licensing Act 2003. Any person wishing to appeal this decision by the licensing authority to refuse to grant the application, or any conditions imposed on the licence should do so within the period of 21 days from the receipt of written notification of the decision appealed against. Any appeal must be sent directly to the Magistrates' Court.
