Dear Sirs,

We are writing to you to strongly object to the extension of licensing hours to 10pm at Morrisons Daily, Hempnall, on the grounds of public nuisance and crime and disorder.

As neighbours to the shop we feel very concerned that as this is a village without street lighting to encourage people to buy alcohol further into the late evening would only encourage more crime and disorder. We feel that to encourage the sale of alcohol even later in the evening, especially during these difficult financial times for many people, the shop could be an easy target for burglary and violent attacks on customers as well as shop workers (some of whom are female are now made to work solo in the shop & Post Office in the evening and lock up the shop). There have already been a number of violent attacks on the nearby One Stop convenience store in Long Stratton.

This is also a village within a conservation area so to encourage more people to drive into the village from surrounding areas late into the evening will only have a detrimental effect on the environment.

Apparently all Morrisson's Daily shops open until 10pm but if one looks at the location of these local shops they are in much bigger residential areas than our small conservation village and have street lighting available.

Please do not allow the extension of licensing hours until 10pm. 6am - 9pm provides more than enough time in such a small village to meet all local needs.
